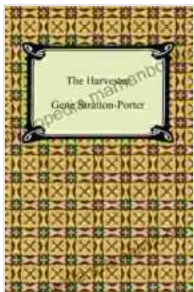
The Harvester

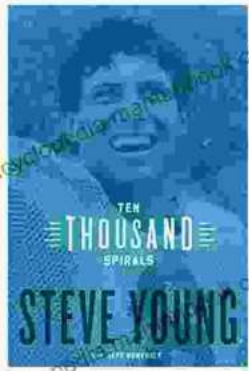
