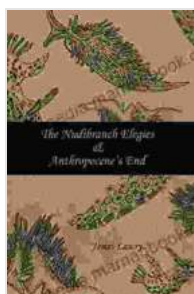


The Nudibranch Elegies: An Anthropocene End

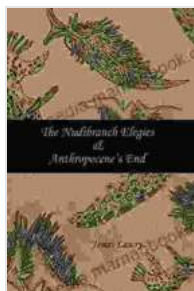

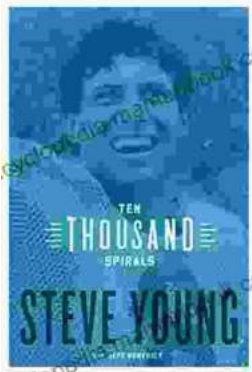
