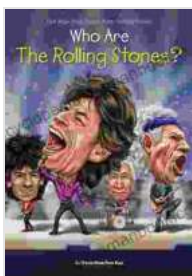


# Their Satanic Majesties: The Rolling Stones Unmasked

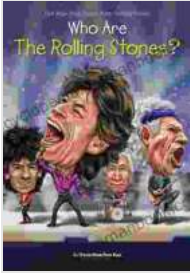

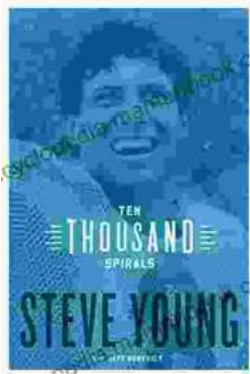
